Upcoming Events/Reminders:

On Monday next week our incubators and eggs arrive. We will be watching the eggs carefully to see when they hatch into chicks!

Term 2 is shaping up to be a busy one, we have so many exciting things coming your way and we can't wait to share them with you!

In conjunction with Essential Assessment and our Point of Need Websites, we have covered a number of topics in **Mathematics** this term including Number and Place Value, Using Units of Measurement and Data Representation and Interpretation, as well as continued our regular 3-6 Processes Workshops. The students are loving the implementation of our Point of Need Sites and it is so wonderful to see them take pride and ownership of their learning. They should be proud!

In **Literacy**, we have developed our Writer's and Reader's Notebooks, helping us to create some great pieces of writing. We have continued work using the 6+1 Writing Traits and as a level, have started studying "The Magic Faraway Tree", using a variety of reading comprehension strategies such as predicting, questioning, summarising and visualising.

Our **Inquiry** topic for the term is centered around 'Our Changing Earth'. We have been/will be exploring natural phenomenon in great depth and the students are looking forward to our excursion to the Melbourne Museum and Imax. Remember to return your permission slip and money by the due date noted on the form! The students so far have explored, Earthquakes, Volcanos, Tsunamis and Tornados. They are retaining so many facts and information. Well done!

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
